Course Description

The content of this course includes an overview of the entire doctrine of revelation beginning with revelation in general, proceeding to redemptive revelation, concluding with a treatment of the doctrine of Scripture which examines both its major attributes and the issue of the canon.

By means of the assigned reading, class discussion, course lectures, regular quizzes, papers, the student will be able to understand and identify the major historical and contemporary issues with regard to the Doctrine of the Word and develop and express a biblical approach to those issues.
