Course Description

Greek of I John (aka Greek 2.5) is a one-credit course that is meant to help students who have just completed Greek II to stay in their Greek NT over the summer semester and prepare them for the strenuous Greek III (Intermediate Greek) course. It is also meant to help former Greek students get reinitiated back into their Greek NT and the grammar of Greek by taking up a fairly simple NT book like 1 John. This course is to review and refresh the beginning grammar covered in as well as make use of concepts and terms that will be employed in intermediate Greek.

Educational Objectives

The instructor will guide students toward achieving a firm grasp of the Koine Greek language. Upon completion of this course, students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate ability to translate smoothly from Greek into English in weekly homework assignments.
- 2. Demonstrate ability to parse all Greek words in quizzes.
- 3. Have memorized all the vocabulary words in 1 John in vocab quizzes and translations.
- 4. Explain, diagram, and speak about the syntax of 1 John in homework assignments and class time.
- 5. Sight-read and translate 1 John in class and for the final exam.
- 6. Become acquainted with reading the text from ancient Manuscripts, including both majuscules and minuscules.

Course Requirements

Assessments:

- 1. Students will demonstrate their ability to translate *Koine* Greek sentences and to parse assigned words through the various translation exercises, vocab quizzes, and parsing quizzes.
- 2. All vocab and parsing quizzes will be taken on Pathway.
- 3. Translation exercises will be graded by fellow students. Each student will have a partner, and they will each review one another's translation assignment. They will share their notes on accuracy, and report on Pathway of their partner's completion of the assignment.
- 4. Students will read through the *1 John Reader* and the *1 John* EGGNT and submit a percentage of completion on Pathway.
- 5. Students will take a final translation exam wherein they will be asked to translate any portion from 1 John with no helps or aids. Only their GNT may be used. The portion of text will be revealed at the start of the exam, and the students will record themselves translating the passage with their GNT in hand (visibly on the screen). The exam starts when the video begins and the student discovers the passage to be translated. The video must then be submitted on the Pathway assignment created.

Online Students:

For this class we are going to use Zoom as it will allow online students to be able to participate and interact more with the instructor. Learning a new language requires interaction and the ability to ask questions. Hopefully this medium will allow for such engagement. For the first class, try to arrive in the Zoom meeting room early to work out all of the bugs.

Contacting Professor:

You may send the professor a direct message through Pathway, email his personal address, or text messages (or phone call if necessary). <u>However, if questions arise concerning specific assignments, then the student needs to contact the professor in the comments portion of the specific assignment in question.</u>

Attendance:

Without prior approval, your attendance to the live class meetings is required. Students must contact the Professor to request an approved absence. He/she must also watch the recorded lecture later.

Grading Plan:

The course grade will be based on the following grading plan (though this may be changed at instructor's discretion):

- Vocab & Parsing Quizzes = 30%
- Translation Exercises = 20%
- Reading 1 John Reader = 5%
- Reading EGGNT = 5%
- Online Interaction & Participation = 5%
- Final Exam = 30%

 - Keep your original, but revise a new version after studying EGGNT (you may or may not agree with Plummer's diagrams, so be ready to explain)
 - Submit Diagram on Pathway and compare with fellow students.
 - o Charitably review and/or comment on 2 other students' diagrams.
