Schedule	2 hours per week, Fall, 2025, beginning Aug 21, 2025.		
Content	This course introduces students to particular challenges of ministering to children and provides an opportunity to apply and deepen the biblical counseling approach to personal sanctification.  In addition to lectures and reading this course includes practical application in three areas: 7 hours of mentored counseling of a child or adolescent, a self-counseling project, and teaching some core course material to a group of children and (if desired) parents.		
Objectives	The course should give students a foundational understanding of biblical childrearing and ministry to children. They will gather valuable counseling experience under the guidance of an experienced mentor. The central conviction of all counseling courses is that having to apply biblical truth reveals what has truly been grasped and provides an opportunity to correct false understanding and solidify right thinking.  Each student will prepare 3-5 outlines to teach some material from the course in a small group or		
	ministry setting. The teaching should be at least 30 minutes long. Only two of the outlines must be actually taught to a group. Preparing to teach promotes learning!		
	Each student must also do a self-counseling project on personal issues in childrearing or children's ministry that the course has revealed.		
	Detailed instructions for these tasks will be provided in handouts.
